STANDING RULES (con't)

A suitable gift shall be presented to each new bride who is a member of the court.

A rosary shall be presented to a lady convert entering the parish.

The Pastor will be presented with a \$25.00 gift for his birthday and also Priest Appreciation Sunday in June.

Get-well cards shall be sent to members and their families. A chairman shall be appointed by the Regent to have charge of these duties.

Each year, Ct. St. Patrick offers to a college freshman (boy or girl), a scholarship in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500) to a Catholic College or vocational school of his or her choice. If no suitable application is received, then two (2) two hundred fifty dollar (\$250) scholarships would be offered to two (2) Catholics (boy or girl) entering a college or vocational school.

These standing rules may not be suspended or amended except at a meeting for which the Regent has sent a written notice to each member through the court bulletin.

Standing rules shall be updated every two years.

The name of this organization shall be Court St. Patrick #1699. Time of the meetings shall be the 3rd Wednesday of each month for all months except July and August when we recess for the summer.

Members will receive Communion in a body on the day of reception of new members and on other Sundays during the year as designated by the Regent or as circumstance demand.

The Memorare and/or Vocation Prayer shall be recited at the conclusion of each meeting.

Officers shall compile a bi-annual yearbook and a copy shall be given to each member.

Flag bearers and banner bearers are to wear white dresses and shoes for installation of officers and reception of new members.

The officers are to be responsible for serving lunch at the September meeting.

A suitable gift shall be presented to each new baby of a member of the court.
